the Waverly First United Methodist Church, where he served on the Pastor Parish Relationship Committee as chairman.

Walt was most instrumental in running Caruthers Farms, which will be recognized as a sesquicentennial farm by the Department of Agriculture in 2022. It was there that he enjoyed tending to the herds and flocks of many animals and rows of crops.

Walt married Linda Shekelton in 1969 and had three children Carrie (Gary) Howell, Jill (Mike) Keeton and Shari (Todd) Edwards and 7 grandchildren. He led an active lifestyle until his death on August 10, 2020, where faith, family and farming were the center of it all. Despite his physical disability, Walt never once complained or made excuses as to why something could not be done. He succeeded at being successful in life, in farming, in raising a family, and in setting a good example of what a good man and a good farmer are!
